If children appear unwell in the morning, please DON'T send them to school (no matter how they protest) as often they become unwell and distressed if sick in class.

If a child becomes unwell at school, we will phone firstly mum/dad and then, if they are not available, the nominated emergency contact, whose name and phone number will be asked for at the start of term. In cases involving sickness/diarrhoea, we have been advised that children should be kept at home for 48 hours after the sickness has stopped, to stop the spread of infection. We would appreciate your co-operation in this, as staff and children can fall prey to these bugs.



There are two lunch options, either a packed lunch prepared at home or a school meal. Meals are free for P1-5 pupils. P6&7 pay £2.05 per day. Milk is also available but must be pre-booked via ParentPay and costs 29p. The lunches, which are cooked on the premises, provide several well-balanced choices daily and are both delicious and great value. Menus are sent home twice a year so that children can choose meals with your help. If enough families are interested, pupils can have breakfast in school from 8.15am. If the Breakfast Club does not run, pupils can have toast and juice at 10.30am.

Let him/her name the objects he/she knows and tell him/her the names of new things. Tell him/her the start of a familiar story and let him/her finish. Help him/her to cut out pictures from old magazines and stick them into a scrapbook. Write the name of the object underneath using small letters, not capitals. Ask your child to tell you things in order, such as the things he/she has done during the day. When you ask your child questions, help him/her to give a full reply instead of one or two words. Teach your child songs and nursery rhymes. Read a bedtime story to him/her as often as possible. After reading a story, go through the pages again. Perhaps he/she will be able to give you the outline of the story.
